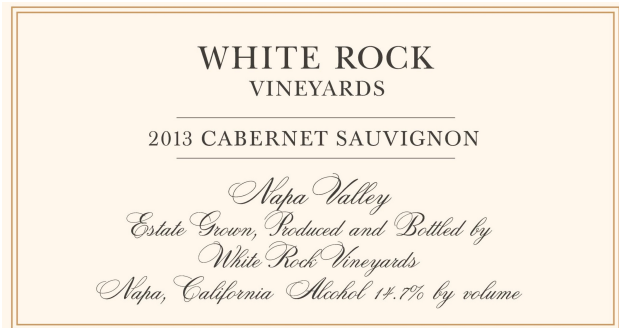
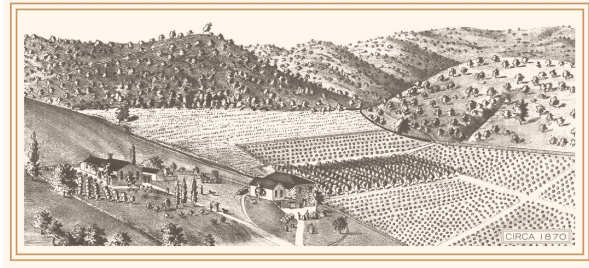

Vineyard: Estate grown, produced, and bottled one mile off Silverado Trail, east of Yountville on the south end of the Stag's Leap Range. East and west facing hilltops with white volcanic ash soils in a microclimate a few degrees cooler than the valley floor.



ACCOLADES

The 2013 Cabernet Sauvignon Napa is a beauty, with loads of graphite, white chocolate, crème de cassis and blackberry fruit are present in this medium to full bodied wine with excellent texture, length, and personality. The wine tips the scales at 14.7% alcohol, and was aged 24 months in one third new French oak. Stylistically it reminded me of a hypothetical blend of a Bordeaux- Medoc and a ripe Napa Cabernet. It's dark ruby purple and should drink well for 15 years or more. **92 points, Robert Parker**

Aromas of blueberries, tar and cherries follow through to a full body, firm and silky tannins and a chewy finish. Shows structure and composure. **93 points, James Suckling**

A structured and subtle wine with a lovely four-square balance and elegance. Tart blackberry and dense chocolate on the palate; somewhat European in style. **90 points, Decanter**
